"Telling Our Story, Writing Our Future" is the theme of the Arizona Coalition Against Domestic Violence's 30th Anniversary Celebration and Conference. As we celebrate 30 years of successful programming, events, societal and political changes that have enhanced services for survivors of domestic violence and created systems of offender accountability, we will acknowledge the challenges, struggles, and achievements that made this possible. We will also look forward to explore and imagine what is next for the domestic violence movement.

WORKSHOP PRESENTATIONS

The Coalition is seeking innovative workshops in the following tracks:

Sustaining Today's and Developing Tomorrow's Leaders

This track will provide existing and aspiring leaders with the information and tools necessary to respond to today's challenges. Suggested Topics include: leadership, team building, communications and media strategies, leading for social change, grant writing, grant management, finances and budgeting, strategic planning, fundraising, program evaluation, working with a board of directors, and managing change.

Back to the Basics: Safety Issues

This track will focus on the core of the Domestic Violence movement, safety. Suggested Topics include: fatality review, the courts and child custody, supervised visitation, survivor centered advocacy, creating safe environments for survivors from diverse backgrounds, and technology safety.

We Didn't Get Here Alone: Multi-Disciplinary Collaborations

This track will highlight successful multi-disciplinary collaborations. Presenters are encouraged to present strategies that can be replicated in other communities.

Change and Growth

This track will provide a forum for organizations and agencies to discuss how they have adapted and grown as the work has challenged them. Organizations and agencies that have conducted assessments of their community and have created change are encouraged to submit proposals.

Uncharted Territory

This track will focus on emerging issues and research. Suggested Topics include: primary prevention, redefining domestic violence, gender symmetry, responding to backlash, the impact of returning soldiers on domestic violence, and services for women who stay with their abuser.

All workshop presentations will be 90 minutes in length.
